AMAZING ENVIRONMENTS

As you will have seen, the new build is well underway and remains on track for opening in September 2025. Academy staff, Wellspring Trust and designers are in design mode to ensure we have amazing learning environments.

We want our environment to be truly inspirational to the pupils, staff and community. We want it to be a space that ignites curiosity, promotes engagement and echoes our inclusive ethos.

As well as the design, we start to turn our attention to how pupils will engage in learning, and how teachers can continue to meet the needs of all pupils. Technology will play a key role but also having fantastic resources like the 3G football pitch.



ENRICHMENT

Our enrichment activities are designed to foster the development of essential life skills. These activities focus on three key areas: values, decision-making, and social interactions.

We explore the values that guide our behaviour, such as ethics, morality, and trustworthiness, helping participants understand their importance and application in everyday life.

We also work on honing decision-making skills, teaching effective strategies for making sound choices.


Finally, we focus on improving social interaction skills, empowering individuals to build strong and positive relationships with family, peers, and the broader community.


BEACON MENU
